Has / Have got

· There is / are

How many dogs are there?

He's John. Are you Mary? I'm not tired.

The present continuous (affirmative only)

Mr Brown is watching television.

'Can' for ability and requests

Mrs Brown can swim.

'Let's' for simple suggestions

Let's go to the cinema.

 The simple present tense for habits – affirmative, negative and interrogative Lions eat meat.

The baby doesn't eat hamburgers.

Does Mrs Brown start work at 8.00?

Ben is older than Sophie.

Ben is better at English than Sophie.

· Superlatives of adjectives

Anna is the youngest girl in her class.

· Conjunction 'because'

Billy was late for school because he missed the bus.
